What should be the role HWBP?

Group 1 (Nevila's Group)

HWBP Commissioner and provider role?

Identify shared priorities

Place Survey results? – need to examine those more closely

- Got to look at what each partner provides as a group e.g. older people, young people,
- Look at an area that we all have to deliver services in based on evidence
- Find a large team practical project which everyone can deliver on
- Transparency and trust in the commissioning system
- The partnership should have a say in commissioning
- If so how do we vote?
- No sole reliance on funding – must remember we are providing a service to people
- CYP Extended groups have a cluster approach (Stonehouse, Dursley) but reliance on county £ resulted wasted work when withdrawn

Group 2 (FC-S)

- Wish list?
- We can identify priorities but could be skewed by people making the decisions
- How do these link in with county HWB groups?
- Area based?
- Look at need and providing the solution
- Retain information sharing and valuable
- Both commissioning and providing
- Full clarity on the agenda of items
- Fully briefed and how they can input
- One pot of funding may be potentially uncertain

What should the Terms of Reference be?

Group 1

Vision and aims

Terms of Reference should be about:

Attendance at meetings, agendas out, timelines, substituting others. Governance.

The co-ordinator that brings together policies, strategies, resource, best practice project information, best evidence resource.

Group 2

Joe Forbes' suggestion that the structure of ToR should be as follows:

AIM AND VISION

To work in partnership to improve the health and wellbeing of people in Stroud district.

Or

To facilitate the provision of voluntary resources with the aim of improving the health and wellbeing of the people of Stroud. (J Forbes)

TERMS OF REFERENCE: (How we do it)

By using available resources to commission projects that improve the health and wellbeing of the people of Stroud and that includes looking at needs and setting priorities.

Providing a forum for information sharing, networking and support for local agencies involved in promoting health and wellbeing

Providing a lobbying function by highlighting unmet health and wellbeing needs

Identifying resources and funding possibilities

Set 3

Lead for particular project?

Must have system in place for commissioning, so everyone understands

Set 2

Define where work is needed. Particular areas e.g. Dursley/Cam, Stonehouse if existing data (supports?) Is this too narrow?

Could CYP & HWBP groups complement each other?

How do we decide priorities. Could be skewed to a particular group?

Set 4

Big element – information sharing and networking

HWBP is both commissioner and provider. Can't split. Membership must be fully briefed – clarity about which is being discussed.
