Following the publication of the review of polling places I would like to propose a change to the Thrupp School polling station. Although the draft order considers that it is satisfactory I would argue that it isn't 1- Disabled access is weak 2- Parking is on the roadside only, the road is unusually narrow and only has passing places in a small 3- The polling station services a relatively modest number of electors 4- Given the distances people need to travel to polling stations in the neighbouring wards such as Minchinhampton and Amberley and Woodchester the people of Thrupp are unusually advantaged by the closeness of the station, which is matched in the towns but less so in rural areas. 5- The socio-economic costs of closing the school, a decision that the Governors of Thrupp School have in my mind rightly made is very high given the size of the electorate. As a school heading towards 150 children there are 100 plus family adversely affected. It must also be remembered that in years with 2 elections the school will be shut twice effectively reducing the time to educate children by 1% in a year. This is not insignificant. 6- Less than $1\overline{0}\%$ of polling stations throughout the district are in schools, there is no compelling reason for using Thrupp school purely because it is a school.

- 7- Thrupp is not blessed with a vast number of publically accessible buildings, but this does not mean that a more agreeable solution could not be found.
- 8- The population of the polling district is mainly working age, there is not a mass of older people and with universal availability of absentee voting there is no reason why an elector should be disadvantaged by a move in polling place.
- 9- My initial thought was that Stroud Brewery could be accessible, it is relatively flat and could accommodate the station. The District has a number of licensed premises in use as polling stations. I have however dismissed this for the reason in paragraph 10.
- 10- The other polling district in Thrupp ward used the Thrupp and Brimscombe Social Centre. This is a large amenity with plenty of space for a second polling station and for the reasons outlined above offers an improved arrangement when looking holistically at the effect of polling on the whole ward.

Review of Polling districts and Polling Places 2015

In accordance with the provisions of the Representation of the People Act 1983 and Section 16 of the Electoral Administration Act 2006 the Council must undertake a review of the polling districts and polling places within its area every four years. The next review was due to take place within five years; however, the Local Government Boundary Commission for England (LGBCE) undertook an electoral review of Stroud and published its final recommendations for the Stroud District ward boundaries in June 2015.

The recommendations were to maintain the number of District Councillors at 51, create a number of new wards and significantly change the boundaries of some existing wards, with effect from the whole council elections in May 2016. As a result, the Council now needs to amend the polling districts in some wards and, in some cases, the polling stations.

Our review will formally start on **Monday 2nd November 2015**. This will commence the public consultation period which will end on **Monday 14th December 2015**. Once concluded, proposals will be reviewed by the Electoral Services team with final proposals being considered by Full Council on Thursday 28th January 2016. If agreed, the amendments will come into effect when the revised electoral register is published on Monday 1st February 2016.

I am therefore writing to you as a District Councillor who has a specific interest in the delivery of the Electoral process within the Stroud District to invite your comments on the current arrangements.



There is no problem with polling at Kingswood Village Half, but there needs to be an additional sign to inform infirm or disabled voters that they should arrive at the Entrance Door from the Car Park at the rear of the building to avoid the step up from in front of the windows of the community room, which is where the Polling station is sited. i.e. Keep right around the building, through the car park and then head back towards the entrance. On leaving the building the same route should be taken. There is however a grab handle on the wall by the step.



It is a slightly further distance than approaching from the front of the building and then keeping left but access is then level.
