- 'A day in the life of a teen' event that brought young people and adults together to explore various youth related issues;
- A series of live music events in a rural market town increasing community cohesion amongst young people;
- An information gathering and sharing video project on mental health, entitled 'what I'd like you to know';
- Speed watch initiatives with the Police relating to safe and social driving in rural areas:
- Various consultative projects with local stakeholders, including the Police and Parish and Town Councils around issues relating to anti-social behaviour and regeneration.

Respective youth forum groups also had a huge influence in the re-opening of four youth centres in the district, whereby they ensured a youth voice was heard in determining the need for such places and their subsequent design.

The district youth council have a long history of working with adult decision makers to influence changes. Whilst some young people have been members for up to 5 years, relationships with organisations like the NHS Clinical Commissioning Group are ongoing in which to help make changes to services.
