## Independent Living categories

A brief reminder of the three types of Independent Living schemes:



# Independent Living Hub

The Hubs have a communal lounge that can be used for activities, open to visitors from other schemes as well as the wider community. The Hubs provide a place for partners in the community to come together and address issues that matter to them.



# **Independent Living Plus**

These schemes have a smaller communal lounge for residents, their family, friends and support network. They can be used as 'Satellite Hubs', whereby activities from the Hubs can take place, allowing more people to benefit.



# Independent Living

These schemes do not have their own communal lounge, however residents can use the facilities at Hubs and Independent Living Plus schemes, with the opportunity to socialise and access various activities. This allows residents to live independently with as much or as little support as needed.

# Completed Schemes



## Hamfallow Court, Berkeley

IL+

Hamfallow Court, completed in August 2023, was the fifth Independent Living Plus scheme to be modernised.

The project included removing an unused office space, creating a large open area by removing the wall between the kitchen and lounge, refurbishing the laundry and converting an unused communal shower into a Wellbeing Room.





#### Walter Preston Court, Cashes Green

Walter Preston Court, completed in March 2024, was the sixth Hub to be modernised.

The lounge and kitchen were opened up to create a large space, with access to a games room featuring a dart board and pool table, kindly provided by our contractors. It was the first scheme to use the 'Wildflower Common' mood board, chosen by residents.

Outside space was an important addition for residents, so a large canopy was added for year-round outdoor use, along with scooter and bin stores at the front. The corridors received new ceilings, flooring and decoration, with each floor assigned a colour theme for easier navigation. The guest rooms and Wellbeing Room were also refurbished.

#### **Archway Gardens, Paganhill**

Completed in April 2024, Archway Gardens was the sixth Independent Living Plus scheme to be



modernised. Despite its small size, the impact was significant. The wall between the kitchen and lounge couldn't be removed, but the doorway was widened to create an opening. An unused office was removed, creating a larger entrance hall with access to the communal toilet and a reconfigured, ensuite guest room.



#### The Beeches, Kings Stanley

Completed in September 2024, The Beeches was the seventh Independent Living Plus scheme to be modernised. The kitchen and lounge wall were removed to create an open space. The entrance corridor was redesigned for better access to the communal toilet. The guest room is now ensuite and externally accessed. Corridors received new ceilings, flooring, heating, and lighting.



## **Dryleaze House, Wotton-under-Edge**

HUB

Work is ongoing at Dryleaze House, the seventh Hub to be modernised.

Structural work is complex, especially for removing the kitchen-lounge wall. A canopy will be added off the lounge for year-round garden use. The laundry, guest rooms, door entry system and fire alarm system are being upgraded. Residents are kept informed about the progress through coffee mornings with our contractor.





You never know what you might find during the 'strip out', and we often come across unexpected extra work.

For example, we knew the kitchen floor at Dryleaze House needed some work but weren't expecting a full replacement.

Other surprises we've had in the past include leaking pipes, damp patches in roof voids, the need for enhanced fire stopping and a large wasp nest that nearly delayed the grand opening of one of our hubs!

#### **Future work**

fter completing The Corriett, we will modernise a further three Independent Living Plus schemes: Ashwell House in Painswick, Hazelwood in Stonehouse and St Nicholas Court in Hardwicke.

We will start the consultation process with residents over the next few months, asking for their 'wish list.' While we can't promise to fulfil every request, we prioritise incorporating residents' ideas into our designs.

- Providing smart TVs for the refurbished lounges
- Providing materials for craft projects with primary schools, used to make bird boxes



- Supporting local scouts, primary schools and a donkey sanctuary
- Providing spare timber and paint to residents
- Helping residents to carry shopping upstairs when a lift was out of action
- Donating items like patio furniture, dart boards and pool tables
- Helping a resident change a flat tyre
