Brief Description: The Horsley Play Area project, completed in March 2025, included new posts for the sunsail, replacement log stepping stones up to the play castle, and an improved entrance area with new gravel grids.  Date Project Completed: March 2025

Has the project been successful? Yes, the project has been successful, and the play area is well used. Before the works, areas of the play area had to be cordoned off as the log stepping stones were rotten and were disintegrating, so were dangerous and unusable, as were the large supporting wooden posts for the sunsail.
